Figure 1. Marginal Effects Estimates for Time in All Evening Work (γ^* estimator).

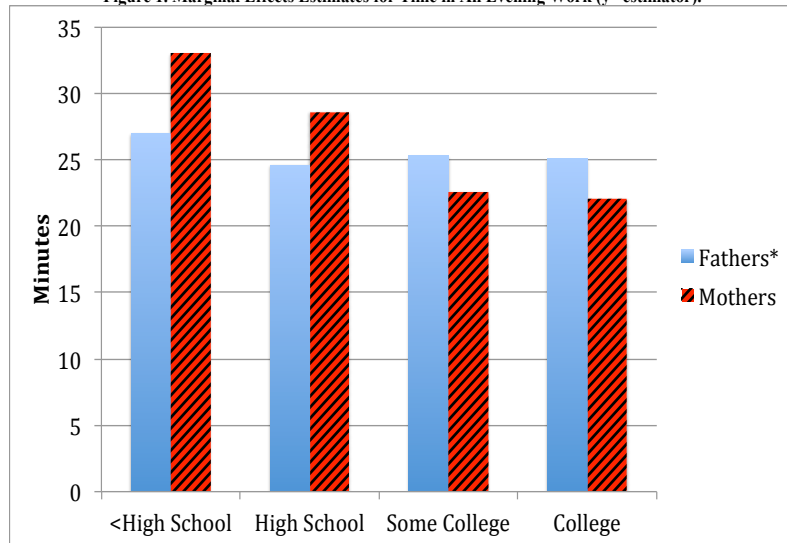


Figure 2. Marginal Effects Estimates for Time in Evening Work Away from Home (γ^* estimator).

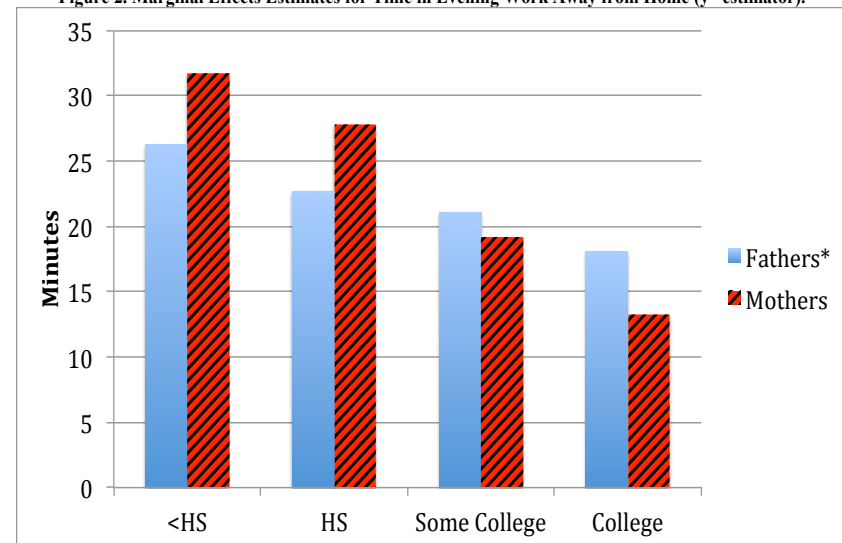
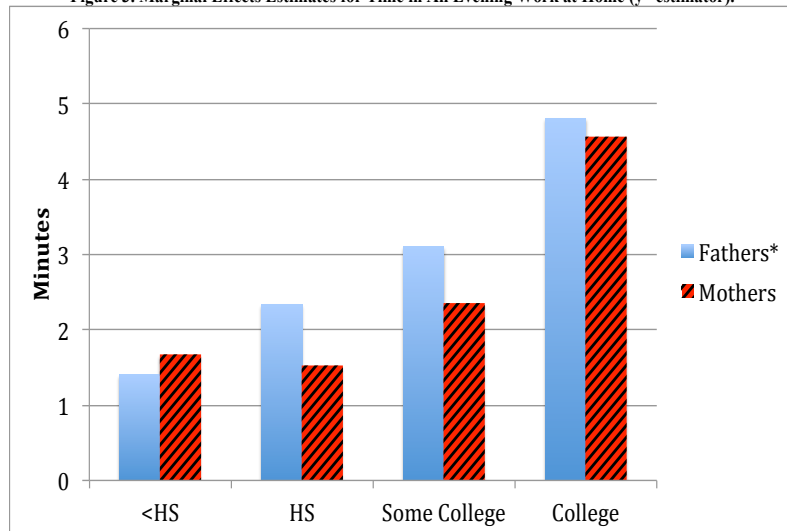


Figure 3. Marginal Effects Estimates for Time in All Evening Work at Home (γ^* estimator).



- All evening work varies slightly by education.
- Highly educated parents are predicted to do the least evening work away from home.
- Highly educated parents are predicted to do the most evening work at home.
- Less educated parents, who already do the least parenting, have the most work-conflict during parenting times.
- Results are marginal effects of Tobit models controlling for age, marital status, work hours on diary day, age of youngest child, and number of household children.
